Celebrant: The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Parents and Godparents: I present KEEGAN & KANE to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Celebrant: Will you be responsible for seeing that KEEGAN & KANE are brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Parents and Godparents: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you by your prayers and witness help KEEGAN & KANE to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Parents and Godparents: I will, with God's help.

The Celebrant asks the following questions of the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of LUCY:

Celebrant: Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Response: I renounce them.

Celebrant: Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the

creatures of God?

Response: I renounce them.

Celebrant: Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Response: I renounce them.

Celebrant: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

*Response:* I do.

Celebrant: Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Response: I do.

Celebrant: Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

*Response:* I do.

The Celebrant addresses the congregation, saying

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support KEEGAN & KANE in their lives in Christ?

People's Response: We will.

The Celebrant then says these or similar words:

Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

# The Baptismal Covenant

Celebrant: Do you believe in God the Father?

People: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Celebrant: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, He was conceived by the power of

the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the

Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Celebrant: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

*People*: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Celebrant: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of the bread, and in the prayers?

People: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

*People:* I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

People: I will, with God's help.

Prayers for the Candidates

Celebrant: Let us now pray for KEEGAN & KANE who are to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

A Person appointed leads the following petitions:

Leader: Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Open their hearts to your grace and truth.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Fill them with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Keep them in the faith and communion of your holy Church.

Leader: Bring them to the fullness of your peace and glory.


People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Thanksgiving over the Water Procession to the Font



The Celebrant blesses the water, first saying

The Lord be with you.

*People:* And with thy spirit.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks unto the Lord our God.

*People:* It is meet and right so to do.

Celebrant: We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water.

Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it thou led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it thy Son Jesus Christ received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life. We thank thee, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore, in joyful obedience to thy Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Now sanctify this water, we pray thee, by the power of thy Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To whom, with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and evermore. *Amen*.

# The Baptism

KEEGAN & KANE are presented to the Celebrant, who then pours water upon each, saying, KEEGAN / KANE, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen*.

When this action has been completed, the Celebrant, at a place in full sight of the congregation, prays over each, saying,

Let us pray.


Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon KEEGAN / KANE your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised hm to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. *Amen*.

Then the Celebrant places a hand on KEEGAN 'S/KANE'S head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross and saying to him,

KEEGAN / KANE, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. *Amen*.

When KEEGAN & KANE have been baptized, the Celebrant hands a candle to each set of sponsors, saying, Receive the light of Christ, a sign of the new life enkindled within these children. Let us welcome the newly baptized.

Celebrant and People: We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.



The Peace

Celebrant: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People: And with thy spirit.

The Ministers and People greet one another in the Name of the Lord.






Then, facing the Holy Table, the Celebrant says,

#### The Consecration

Celebrant: Let us pray.

ALL glory be to thee, Almighty God, our heavenly Father, for that thou, of thy tender mercy, didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption; who made there, by his one oblation of himself once offered, a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction, for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of that his precious death and sacrifice, until his coming again.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, he took bread; and when he had given thanks, he brake it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." \*

Likewise, after supper, he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink ye all of this; for this is my Blood of the New Testament, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins. Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me." \*

Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, according to the institution of thy dearly beloved Son our Savior Jesus Christ, we, thy humble servants, do celebrate and make here before thy divine Majesty, with these thy holy gifts, which we now offer unto thee, the memorial thy Son hath commanded us to make; having in remembrance his blessed passion and precious death, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; rendering unto thee most hearty thanks for the innumerable benefits procured unto us by the same.


And we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us; and, of thy almighty goodness, vouchsafe to bless and sanctify, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, these thy gifts and creatures of bread and wine; that we, receiving them according to thy Son our Savior Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood.

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; most humbly beseeching thee to grant that, by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we and all thy whole Church, may obtain remission of our sins and all other benefits of his passion.

And here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy, and living sacrifice unto thee; humbly beseeching thee that we, and all others who shall be partakers of this Holy Communion, may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction, and made one body with him that he may dwell in us, and we in him.





The Last Gospel

St. John I:I-I4

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

*People:* And with thy spirit.

Celebrant: The Beginning of the holy Gospel according to John.

*People:* ▶ Glory be to thee, O Lord.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God. All things were made by Him: and without Him was not anything made that was made. In Him was life, and the life was the light of men: and the light shineth in the darkness, and the darkness comprehended it not. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. The same came for a witness, to bear witness of the light, that all men through him might believe. He was not that light, but was sent to bear witness of that light. That was the true light, which lighteth every man that cometh into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not. He came unto his own, and his own received him not. But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name: which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God. 

A Contemplative Retreat

#### An Invitation:

At a time when churchwide conversations are seeking deeper ground for our practical theology of money, this contemplative retreat offers an opportunity for Episcopal lay leaders and clergy in the seven dioceses of New England to listen together to Jesus' words as they speak to money's role in supporting and enlivening the mission of God among us.

Using the words of Jesus as our only text, we will pray the gospel together in a practice of sacred reading known as *lectio divina*. Those who engage with money as a vocation in the church will be offered spiritual disciples that will renew and strengthen their calling.

Steven is co-founder of Wisdom & Money; a student of Cynthia Bourgeault's Wisdom Schools; former Canon Pastor at The Cathedral Church of St Paul, Boston; and member of the Trustees of Donations to the Protestant Episcopal Church in Massachusetts.


