A Reading from the First Book of Samuel.

THE LORD said to Samuel, "How long will you grieve over Saul? I have rejected him I from being king over Israel. Fill your horn with oil and set out; I will send you to Jesse the Bethlehemite, for I have provided for myself a king among his sons." Samuel said, "How can I go? If Saul hears of it, he will kill me." And the LORD said, "Take a heifer with you, and say, 'I have come to sacrifice to the LORD.' Invite Jesse to the sacrifice, and I will show you what you shall do; and you shall anoint for me the one whom I name to you." Samuel did what the LORD commanded, and came to Bethlehem. The elders of the city came to meet him trembling, and said, "Do you come peaceably?" He said, "Peaceably; I have come to sacrifice to the LORD; sanctify yourselves and come with me to the sacrifice." And he sanctified Jesse and his sons and invited them to the sacrifice. When they came, he looked on Eliab and thought, "Surely the Lord's anointed is now before the LORD." But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him; for the LORD does not see as mortals see; they look on the outward appearance, but the LORD looks on the heart." Then Jesse called Abinadab, and made him pass before Samuel. He said, "Neither has the LORD chosen this one." Then Jesse made Shammah pass by. And he said, "Neither has the LORD chosen this one." Jesse made seven of his sons pass before Samuel, and Samuel said to Jesse, "The LORD has not chosen any of these." Samuel said to Jesse, "Are all your sons here?" And he said, "There remains yet the youngest, but he is keeping the sheep." And Samuel said to Jesse, "Send and bring

him; for we will not sit down until he comes here." He sent and brought him in. Now he was ruddy, and had beautiful eyes, and was handsome. The LORD said, "Rise and anoint him; for this is the one." Then Samuel took the horn of oil, and anointed him in the presence of his




Celebrant: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

■ Glory be to thee, O Lord.

A S he passed by, he saw a man blind from his birth. And his disciples asked him, "Rabbi, Awho sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" Jesus answered, "It was not that this man sinned, or his parents, but that the works of God might be made manifest in him. We must work the works of him who sent me, while it is day; night comes, when no one can work. As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world." As he said this, he spat on the ground and made clay of the spittle and anointed the man's eyes with the clay, saying to him, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam" (which means Sent). So he went and washed and came back seeing. The neighbors and those who had seen him before as a beggar, said, "Is not this the man who used to sit and beg?" Some said, "It is he"; others said, "No, but he is like him." He said, "I am the man." They said to him, "Then how were your eyes opened?" He answered, "The man called Jesus made clay and anointed my eyes and said to me, 'Go to Siloam and wash'; so I went and washed and received my sight." They said to him, "Where is he?" He said, "I do not know." They brought to the Pharisees the man who had formerly been blind. Now it was a sabbath day when Jesus made the clay and opened his eyes. The Pharisees again asked him how he had received his sight. And he said to them, "He put clay on my eyes, and I washed, and I see." Some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, for he does not keep the sabbath." But others said, "How can a man who is a sinner do such signs?" There was a division among them. So they again said to the blind man, "What do you say about him, since he has opened your eyes?" He said, "He is a prophet." The Jews did not believe that he had been blind and had received his sight, until they called the parents of the man who had received his sight, and asked them, "Is this your son, who you say was born blind? How then does he now see?" His parents answered, "We know that this is our son, and that he was born blind; but how he now sees we do not know, nor do we know who opened his eyes. Ask him; he is of age, he will speak for himself." His parents said this because they feared the Jews, for the Jews had already agreed that if any one should confess him to be Christ, he was to be put out of the synagogue. Therefore his parents said, "He is of age, ask him." So for the second time they called the man who had been blind, and said to him, "Give God the praise; we know that this man is a sinner." He answered, "Whether he is a sinner, I do not know; one thing I know, that though I was blind, now I see." They said to him, "What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?" He answered them, "I have told you already, and you would not listen. Why do you want to hear it again? Do you too want to become his disciples?" And they reviled him, saying, "You are his disciple, but we are disciples of Moses. We know that God has spoken to Moses, but as for this man, we do not know where he comes from." The man answered, "Why, this is a marvel! You do not know where he comes from, and yet he opened my eyes. We know that God does not listen to sinners, but if any one is a worshiper of God and does his will, God listens to him. Never since the world began has it been heard that any one opened the eyes of a man born blind. If this man were not from God, he could do nothing." They answered him, "You were born in utter sin, and would you teach us?" And they cast him out. Jesus heard that they had cast him out, and having found him he said, "Do you believe in the Son of man?" He answered, "And who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?" Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, and it is he who speaks to you." He said, "Lord, I believe"; and he worshiped him. Jesus said, "For judgment I came into this world, that those who do not see may see, and that those who see may become blind." Some of the Pharisees near him heard this, and they said to him, "Are we also blind?" Jesus said to them, "If you were blind, you would have no guilt; but now that you say, 'We see,' your guilt remains."










The Prayers of the People

Lord, in thy mercy *People: hear our prayer*.



Refreshment Sunday

The Fourth Sunday in Lent, Mid-Lent Sunday, is also known as Mothering Sunday or Refreshment Sunday. On this day, the propers speak of Jerusalem as our mother, and also have the theme of God's feeding and caring for his family. In the Middle Ages, a modification of the strict Lenten fast was allowed; rose-colored vestments, more cheerful than the usual Lenten violet, were used; and young children who had been bound out as servants and apprentices were allowed to return home to visit their mothers, making it the equivalent of our Mothers' Day.

For this homecoming occasion, simnel cakes, (made from fine white flour — "simnel" — hence the name) were blessed by the parish priest and distributed as emblems of the love of the human family and of the church as the family of God. At coffee hour today we will serve one version of simnel cake, which is still made in England for festive occasions.

Simnel Cake

Recipe makes enough for 9"x 13" or 9"x 9" pan

I cup unsalted butter Cut each stick of butter into 8 pieces. Put in bowl of processor and

cream with metal blade for 30 sec.

I cup sugar Add to butter and blend until mixture forms a ring around the blade ~

about 30 sec.

4 eggs Add and blend until combined ~ about 5 sec. Scrape bowl.

2 cups cake flour (I2 oz.) Add and pulse until blended ~ about 7 pulses. Spread one-half of batter in

½ tsp. salt pan.

½ cup candied peel (lemon,

orange, and/or citron)

1/2 cup currants

²/₃ roll almond paste or I recipe (q.v.)

If using commercial paste, slice or roll very thin and lay on top of batter in pan. If using homemade, dot over batter. Top with remaining batter

Bake at 300° for about 50 min. When cool, top with glaze (below).

Glaze

I T. soft butter Blend. Add additional milk as needed to make very thin icing.

 $\frac{1}{3}$ /₄ cup confectioner's sugar

I T. milk or cream

I or 2 drops almond extract

I cup blanched almonds

¹/₂ cup sugar I egg white

2 T. unsalted butter
It. almond extract

Almond Paste

Add to $I\frac{1}{2}$ cups boiling water and simmer, uncovered, for 8 min. Drain and allow to cool for 15 min. Put in food processor bowl.

Add to bowl and process with metal blade until smooth, about $1\frac{1}{2}$ min.




