**BONNIE MARION BURNS** loved her life and lived it to the fullest. At the age of 82, she passed away peacefully at the Connecticut Hospice in Branford on October 19, 2025, following a courageous battle with blood cancer. Born in New Haven, Connecticut, on November 30, 1942, to Doris Meloy and William Bernard Burns, Bonnie grew up in Hartford's North End, where the Lenox Theater brought her art and culture and Keney Park offered a world of nature.

After graduating from Weaver High School in 1960, Bonnie had a long and productive career with the Southern New England Telephone Company (SNET), working for over 45 years. She traveled throughout the country training clients on the latest business phone systems, taking pride in connecting with people and helping them master new technology.

When she retired, Bonnie poured that same enthusiasm into new pursuits. Her appreciation of beauty led her to discover a passion for needlepoint, creating pieces so skillful they are considered museum-worthy. While working at a shop in Guilford, she met her dear friend Linda Lee. Stitching became about more than thread and canvas; it was community. She and Linda, along with other stitchers, would gather regularly to chat and create together. Pam Hawes was another dear friend, sharing dinners, laughter, and the joy of time well spent.

Throughout her life, Bonnie embraced travel and exploration. With family, she hiked the White Mountains, rafted the Colorado River through the Grand Canyon, and visited the Pacific Northwest, Maine, Florida, France, Spain, Italy, Greece, and the Netherlands. With friends, she regularly visited Block Island and St. Martin.

Bonnie was an incredible cook, dutifully preparing meals for every holiday, often from treasured recipes passed down through generations. She even took care to make allergy-friendly dishes, ensuring her cooking could be shared by the whole family.

In her younger years, Bonnie had a great love of boating and spent many joyful days on the Connecticut River or Long Island Sound, enjoying the water and the camaraderie of fellow boaters. She was also an avid birder, whether scanning the skies at Hammonasset Beach State Park or enjoying the flurry of wings at her backyard feeders. Her home was filled with warmth and companionship, shared over the years by many beloved cats, including Kitty, Lillin, Munchkin, Amber, Scampie, Suzie, Sam, Buddy, Butch, Pippin, Cricket, Penny, and Pearl, each of whom held a special place in her heart.

She was predeceased by her brother William Burns and is survived by her brothers Tom Burns (wife Victoria) and Andy Burns. Bonnie adored her nieces and nephews: Tom's children, Abigail and William, and Andy's children, Eric (wife Jaimie, children Madison and Jackson) and Scott (wife Meghan, children Liam and Cameron). She treated them as her own, celebrating their milestones and growing families, and they cherished her attentive care and the delicious treats she brought to every gathering. She also leaves cousins Jeannie Mioline, Bob and Warren Defrank, and Sue Thomson, along with many dear friends who will carry her memory with love.

In accordance with her wishes, Bonnie will be cremated and her ashes scattered in the Connecticut River at Old Lyme, a place she loved to visit to watch the boats go by. The family wishes to express their deepest gratitude to the dedicated staff of Smilow Cancer Center at Yale and The Connecticut Hospice in Branford for their exceptional care and compassion.

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### *Concerning the Service*

The liturgy for the dead is an Easter liturgy. It finds all its meaning in the Resurrection. Because Jesus was raised from the dead, we, too, shall be raised. The liturgy, therefore, is characterized by joy, in the certainty that "neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." This joy, however, does not make human grief unchristian. The very love we have for each other in Christ brings deep sorrow when we are parted by death. Jesus himself wept at the grave of his friend. So, while we rejoice that one we love has entered into the nearer presence of our Lord, we sorrow in sympathy with those who mourn.
